Just last week UNT Dallas was named the No. 2 university in the nation and No. 1 in

in higher education with a new billboard campaign that showcases our efforts to help make dreams come true through affordable tuition plans and comprehensive scholarship/financial aid programs.

#UNTD News & Campus Updates

The No. 1 Reason We Are Here: A study released this month by LendEDU shows that UNT Dallas ranks No. 1 in Texas and No. 2 nationally among public institutions for lowest student debt. Using data licensed from Peterson's College Data, LendEDU posted its 2018 Student Loan Debt by School by State Report online. At UNT Dallas, average tuition and fees is less than \$9,200 per year, and graduates leave with an average of only \$6,927 in loan debt. According to LendEDU, the average American college student from the Class of 2017 graduated with \$28,288 in debt, an increase from \$27,975 that the average Class of 2016 borrower owed. In Texas, the average debt per borrower is \$27,001. LendEDU's data-driven study of student loan debt validates who we are at UNT Dallas. This university was built on the belief that every student should have the opportunity to earn a college degree, regardless of their economic background.

She spent 36 years with AT&T, retiring in 2017 as senior vice president for human resources and chief diversity officer. She grew up in poverty in Richmond, Calif., persevered through a challenging home life and later beat cancer on her path to becoming one of the most successful businesswomen in America. UNT Dallas/Toyota Mobile Market Event: In conjunction with the grant awarded by Toyota, UNT Dallas is thrilled to co-sponsor an important event for our Southern Dallas region, the UNTD/Toyota University Challenge: Low Emission Fresh Mobile Market. The event takes place on campus from 9:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. on Sept. 12. Move-In Day: We are quickly approaching our second Move-In Day on the morning of Saturday, Aug. 25. Wisdom Hall is again full so we'll have plenty of incoming students and parents on campus -- and surely with plenty of questions. Our tremendous faculty and staff have answered the call of Dee Goines, our Director of Residence Life, Housing and Conference Services, as nearly 50 of you signed up to volunteer to help our new Trailblazers move in. Building & Construction Update: Our under-construction-courtyard picked up major steam at the end of July with the pouring of the concrete slab starting from the northwest corner and working towards south and east. This will be followed by forming and pouring the concrete planter walls, sandblasting the concrete slabs to provide the right texture, installing lights, sprinkler lines, etc. By the start of the fall semester, we will be able to walk across the courtyard between Building One and Founders Hall. Trees and plants will be planted later to ensure they will take root. As soon as the courtyard is accessible between the two buildings, Phase II will begin with the removal of the three flag poles for future re-installation at the median between the university sign and the guard shack. The current sidewalk will be removed to make way for a new welcoming drop-off area.

Office of Supported Projects Coming Soon: A major development we're proud to announce is the Sept. 1 opening of the Office of Sponsored Projects and Sponsored Projects Accounting. Faculty and staff will no longer need to dial up Denton for assistance with proposal development, submission, award management or research compliance needs. Alicia Brossette, executive director of sponsored projects, will lead the Office of Sponsored Projects in Building One, Room 344. Janet Burton, director of sponsored projects accounting, with head up Sponsored Projects Accounting in Building One, Room 362M. These new offices will serve as your oncampus support to assist faculty and staff in obtaining and managing sponsored projects while assuring proper

stewardship of those funds.

Gasko Gains Exclusive Membership: Congratulations to Dr. John Gasko, Dean of the School of Education and founder of the Emerging Teacher Institute, for being named a member of Deans For Impact, a 22-member national network of leaders committed to transforming how the United States prepares future educators.

Orientation Wraps Up: A sure sign that summer is almost over and classes are about to begin is the wrapping up of orientation. The final two orientation sessions of the summer are now behind us with transfer students touring our campus on August 16, while the final group of incoming freshmen were here on August 17.

New Dean in Big D: Felecia Epps, the new dean at the College of Law, officially took charge on July 1. Epps, a former Marine and the former dean at Florida A&M College of Law, brings more than 30 years of experience in the law profession to UNT Dallas. She replaces the founding dean, Hon. Royal Furgeson, who will remain with the College of Law in a fundraising role.

Get Your Parking Permit: 2018-19 parking permits went on sale Aug. 1. Current parking permits will expire on Aug. 31. Purchase new permits online or in the Office of Police, Parking and Transportation located in Founders Hall 131, from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday – Friday; and after Sept. 10 from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday – Thursday. Enforcement will begin on Sept. 10.

Distinguished Certification: Our Child Development and Family Studies program earned the Certified Family Life Educator designation from the National Council on Family Relations. This certification allows graduates to bypass a time-intensive and costly certification exam. Students will receive the CFLE credential, which qualifies graduates to complete a CFLE-approved program application, rather than taking the CFLE exam.

In her new role, Greenan will assist Dean Felecia Epps, who took charge on July 1, with outreach to the Dallas community. Greenan joined the College of Law in January 2014. UNT Dallas and El Centro College launch Emerging Teacher Academy

In front of a packed house at El Centro College on Aug. 8, UNT Dallas officially launched its partnership with El Centro College and unveiled the Emerging Teacher Academy, which will primarily focus on creating a pathway for aspiring teachers to earn a bachelor's degree while increasing the number of bilingual teachers in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. "Right now, the school districts have to go all over the Spanish speaking world to find teachers for bilingual students," said UNT Dallas President, Bob Mong. "Well, we can grow our own right here in Dallas County and plenty of people can benefit from that." The partnership will allow students to co-enroll between both institutions. Each student will first earn their associates degree at El Centro, followed by receiving their teaching degree from UNT Dallas.
