Fall 2016 Fact Sheet



The University of North Texas at Dallas (UNT Dallas) is the first and only public four-year university within the city of Dallas. The University was originally established in January 2000 as an upper-division, off-campus location of the University of North Texas. Once the full-time equivalent enrollment of 1,000 students was reached in 2009, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board declared UNT Dallas an independent general academic institution. The University of North Texas at Dallas began operations on September 1, 2010, and was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges in June 2013.

The University encompasses 264 scenic acres with two state-of-the-art buildings totaling 181,254 square feet. The second building, completed in August 2010, has been awarded the LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Gold Certification from the U.S. Green Building Council.

UNT Dallas offers 21 undergraduate and 9 graduate degrees in high-demand fields such as criminal justice, law, teacher education, business, psychology, sociology, and counseling.
