
UNT College of Music Cost of Attendance Facts 2018++

At UNT, any competitive scholarship of \$1,000 or more per academic year guarantees in-state tuition rates for the term of the award.

In the 2017-18 academic year: The College of Music awarded **\$1,163,04.00** in scholarships. ***

One-third of music students (525 out of 1565) received merit scholarships of \$1,000 or more from the College of Music. ***


In-state tuition and fees at UNT averaged \$11,544/year (15 hours per semester) for undergraduates.







