 ANTHROPOLOGICAL THEORY AND METHOD ARE INCREASINGLY IN DEMAND FOR EVALUATIONS BECAUSE OF THE CAPACITY OF ANTHROPOLOGY TO DELINEATE CULTURAL POSITIONS OF INDIVIDUALS AND ORGANIZATIONS AROUND KEY ISSUES OF NEEDS ASSESSMENT, SERVICE DELIVERY, EQUITY AND JUSTICE IN THE DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION OF BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROGRAMS. THE COURSE WILL PROVIDE A GRADUATE-LEVEL EXPERIENCE IN THE FIELD OF EVALUATION ANTHROPOLOGY, AN IMPORTANT AREA FOR JOBS IN PRACTICING AND APPLIED ANTHROPOLOGY IN GOVERNMENT AND THE PRIVATE SECTORS. THE APPROACH TAKEN WILL LINK EVALUATION AND ANTHROPOLOGICAL METHOD AND THEORY AND WILL ADDRESS COMMON METHODOLOGICAL, LOGISTIC AND THEORETICAL ISSUES THAT OCCUR IN THE COURSE OF CONDUCTING EVALUATION PROJECTS USING HOLISTIC, MIXED METHOD AND QUALITATIVE DESIGNS.
