Entry reviews are conducted electronically using unt.slideroom.com during each long semester, with deadlines of 15 October and 15 March. No late portfolios will be accepted.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ENTRY REVIEW:

- When can I apply?
 - You need to have completed your Foundations courses (Drawing I, Drawing II, Design I, Design II).
 - You need to have completed 9 hours of 2000-level or higher Studio Art courses.
 - You need to have completed at least one of the 2000-level or higher courses in the concentration you wish to pursue with a "B" or better grade.
- Can I apply to more than one studio art concentration?
 - Yes! For instance, if you want to review for Ceramics, you need to have taken and completed and earned a B or above in a Ceramics course. If you want to review for both Ceramics and Photography, you need to have taken and completed and earned a B or above in both Ceramics and Photography.
 - You must apply separately for each concentration and may choose to pursue multiple concentrations should you be accepted to them. Upon notification of your acceptance(s), you will be asked to confirm the concentration that you intend to pursue.

What is the minimum GPA for acceptance?

- You must have a GPA of 2.5 or above.
- What if I am not yet a UNT student?
 - Acceptance into the concentration does not constitute acceptance to UNT. You must be accepted into UNT to pursue a BFA at UNT. But, you absolutely may submit your portfolio in advance of your application and acceptance to the university.
- What if I don't pass entry review?
 - You will receive feedback on your portfolio and you may reapply in any subsequent long semester.
