A bachelor's degree with a major in political science will prepare you for many careers in government service, politics, law, and private industry within the United States and abroad. You may work as a lobbyist or citizen's advocacy group in Washington, D.C., or in a state capital; become a public affairs research analyst; manage a non-profit association; or enter the Foreign Service or the Federal Bureau of Investigation. It will also prepare you for law or graduate school.

The following three-year plan is one example of a variety of ways in which you can complete your chosen degree in three years dependent upon having 30 hours upon arrival at UNT, and will serve as a guide for you to design your pathway to degree completion. Variations will depend on what equivalent courses you have already taken.

Options for Advanced Electives in Political Science include courses such as: The Presidency, Mass Media and Politics, Presidential Elections, International Conflict, Civil War, Latin American Politics, Immigration Policy, Revolutions and Political Violence, Modern Political Theory, Nietzsche, Constitutional Law, International Human Rights, Political Parties, The US Supreme Court, and American Foreign Policy
