The Bachelor of Science with a major in interdisciplinary studies (with EC-6 or 4-8 teacher certification) develops highly qualified teachers through a rigorous curriculum with high standards. District administrators report that our graduates are as prepared in their first year of teaching as second- and third-year teachers.

This three-year plan provides a model for on-time completion of this UNT program. See the current *Undergraduate Catalog* for course prerequisites. Course availability at UNT is subject to change, and the plan shown below may change based on updates to UNT's course offerings.

Degree Requirements and Information

- Minimum Grades: Must earn grades of C or above in all required courses.
- UNT GPA: Minimum 2.000 GPA on all course work at UNT.
- GPA (All Courses): Minimum 2.000 GPA on all course work attempted, transfer hours included. *
 See Admission to Teacher Education.
- University Core GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed Core.
- Academic Major GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed Academic Major.
- Professional Development School (PDS) GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed PDS, for all graded courses.
- **Total Hours:** Minimum of 120 total hours, at least 30 hours earned in residence at UNT. Completion of minimum hours required for the degree does not guarantee completion of all degree requirements.
- Best Choices: Specific courses recommended in some core categories. Students may elect to take
 other courses listed under the University Core Curriculum to fulfill these requirements.

Admission to Teacher Education (TEd)

Students must be admitted to Teacher Education (TEd) at UNT to enroll in any courses listed below this section.

- 1) For admission to TEd, a student must have:
 - ☐ Junior standing (60+ credit hours earned);
- □ Appropriate ACT, SAT, or Praxis Core: Academic Skills for Educators scores on record in the COE-SAO;
- □ 2.75+ GPA (All Courses);
- Interview Questionnaire with a Final Result of Interview Approved, go to tiny.cc/untinterview for directions;
- □ 2.75+ Core GPA (all core courses complete); □ Active enrollment at UNT and a completed or in-process degree audit in the COE-SAO.

 2) Once all six (6) requirements are complete, schedule an advising appointment to submit your *Application for Admission to Teacher Education*.
- 3) Upon receiving the Letter of Acceptance to TEd, accept UNT's formal offer of admission to the program within 72 hours.
- 4) Once the offer is accepted, students are eligible to register for TEd courses during a valid enrollment period.
