Thorne Anderson is the Mayborn Endowed Chair for Narrative & Multimedia Journalism in the Mayborn School of Journalism. Before coming to UNT he worked internationally as an independent photojournalist for publications including the *New York Times, Los Angeles Times, Boston Globe, Chicago Tribune* and *Time, Newsweek, U.S. News & World Report,* and *Stern* magazines. He is a co-author/photographer of *Unembedded: Four Independent Photojournalists on the War in Iraq.* Professor Anderson's



professional experience heavily influences his teaching. He is founder and director of Hatch Visuals, a student-run photo agency at UNT. He is also founder and co-director of the "Heart of Mexico" immersion journalism program for narrative storytellers in multimedia documentary. That program received the 2017 NAFSA Paul Simon Spotlight Award for innovation in international education. Professor is a frequent contributor of video shorts to KERA public radio and television, for which he has been recognized with a national RTDNA Edward R. Murrow award for excellence in video.
