Setting up Swivl Instructions



1. Place iPad on Swivl stand.



2. Get lightning to mini USB cable from Swivl case.



3. Plug the lighting port end of the cable to the charging port of the iPad and the mini USB end to the back of the Swivl.



4. Hold down power button to turn on Swivl.



5. Light next to power button and + button will turn red when powered on (If they are both blinking this is an indication to charge the base).



6. Remove marker from dock and hold down power button to turn on the maker.



7. Both lights on marker will turn green and the light next to the + button will turn green when successfully paired.




8. Once cables are plugged in, open Swivl app and when the notification pops up asking to allow the Swivl to connect, press 'Allow".





9. Once cables are plugged in and Swivl app is open, both lights on Swivl should be green as well as the lights on the marker.



10. Once in the Swivl app, click Capture to move onto recording camera.









10.5 (Optional Step) To adjust microphone volume when recording press marker button then select the marker that is not grayed out and finally adjust the volume to the desired level.




11. Click white record button to start recording.




12. Click stop record button to stop recording, once you click it a new window will pop up to name the video.

14. Click the ellipses to open the option bar to Save the video.




15. Click the Save button to save the video to camera roll.







16. Open iConv to convert Swivl video to MP4.



17. Click the + button to get the option to import your video.




18. Click the option Local Libraries to be able to import your video from camera roll.




19. Click the video you would like to use and then select Import.




20. Click Close to return to main app screen to convert video.




21. Click on video and then select Convert.

23. Click on the Converted tab on the bottom to move to final step to save video.




24. Click on Video and the select 'Save to Photos(Camera Roll) to save converted video.



29. Select Desired Folder for uploading video, the folder on the photo will not be the correct folder for everybody.








35. After naming the video click Upload to begin upload process.




36. Uploading will change message a few times like uploading, processing, publishing but is not limited to just these three messages.






38. Make Sure User Sign-in is set to Blackboard, if it is click Sign in.




39. Use Blackboard credentials and then click Login.




40. Select My Folders to find folder where video was uploaded.
