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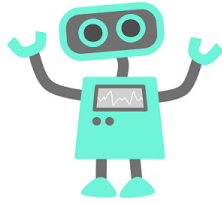

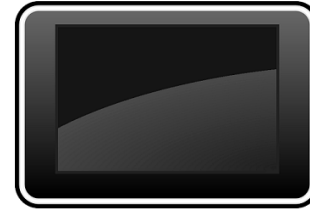


RoboCamp

RoboCamp introduces students to hardware platforms and software development tools. Students will assemble a multi-purpose robot from a kit and learn to interact with and control sensors, motors and related components. Activities include Sumobot wrestling, Roboart and a variety of challenge activities including line following and mazes of varying difficulty.

This camp will not provide lunch or snacks, so students should plan to bring their own. We will provide refillable water bottles to use throughout the week (students will keep water bottles at the end of the camp).

AppCamp

AppCamp teaches students about Mobile App development for Android devices using AppInventor – a tool developed by Google and supported by MIT. Students will build a number of apps using various sensor technologies found in most smartphones and tablets.

This camp will not provide lunch or snacks, so students should plan to bring their own. We will provide refillable water bottles to use throughout the week (students will keep water bottles at the end of the camp).

Internet of Things (IoT) Camp

The Internet of Things (IoT) camp will focus on applying programming skills and ideas to create a simple IoT application.

This camp involves wiring a simple IoT circuit on a breadboard and soldering the designed circuit on a prototype Printed Circuit Board (PCB). Students will program the designed circuit using tools to create a simple IoT device and will build an IoT application and test it using the IoT ecosystem. The students will be provided with resources, hardware, and the materials needed and will take home the PCB circuit that they build.

This camp will not provide lunch or snacks, so students should plan to bring their own. We will provide refillable water bottles to use throughout the week (students will keep water bottles at the end of the camp).

Animation & Games Camp

Animation & Game Camp teaches Computer Science-related topics with an emphasis on design and programming skills applied to creativity in virtual world environments. We use the ALICE programming environment (developed at Carnegie Mellon and used by many universities for introductory programming courses) to teach participants fundamental programming concepts, including storage, loops, and parallel execution. Students will build a virtual world environment that they can take home and continue to expand.

This camp will not provide lunch or snacks, so students should plan to bring their own. We will provide refillable water bottles to use throughout the week (students will keep water bottles at the end of the camp).
