Claimant is an employee of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). Pursuant to Board Rule 407 (48 CFR 6104.407 (2009)), she has requested that this Board reconsider its decision issued on February 16, 2009, denying her claim for expenses which she alleged were incurred during temporary duty travel. We denied the claim based upon the record submitted by the claimant and the agency.

In her request for reconsideration, claimant has made additional arguments that could have been made while her case was pending, and asks this Board to make additional inquiries to the agency with regard to its actions.

Mere disagreement with a decision or re-argument of points already made is not a sufficient ground for seeking reconsideration. Rule 407. Claimant had ample opportunity to submit the additional arguments in her reconsideration request before the record was closed. Information in the possession of claimant which could have been submitted previously is not sufficient grounds for reconsideration. *Mary Ann Wilson*, GSBCA

14300-TRAV, 98-2 BCA ¶ 30,039. Claimant has failed to state sufficient grounds for the Board to reconsider its decision.

Decision

Claimant's request for reconsideration is denied.
