The oldest case was received in 2008 and is scheduled to be heard in October 2011. The remaining 8 cases were received in 2010 and are in various stages of the disciplinary process.	The Board's November 1, 2011 response to ASC staff reported that of the 9 cases referenced in the ASC's October 6, 2011 letter, only 2 have not been resolved. Of the 2 remaining cases, one will be heard on December 6th and the other is pending a consent agreement.
