

OPEN WATER WATERFOWL HUNTERS PROVIDE YOUR INPUT

Take the 2020 – Green Bay and Lake Michigan Hunter Harvest Survey and Questionnaire

About this Hunter Survey –

In 2021, the Wisconsin waterfowl hunting zone structure will change by eliminating the Mississippi River Zone and implementing a new Open Water Zone. The Open Water Zone will be specific to the offshore, open waters of Lake Michigan and Green Bay. Specific regulations for this new zone, that starts 500 feet offshore and extends to the state boundary, still need to be developed and input from hunters will provide a means of tailoring the season framework for this open water environment.
