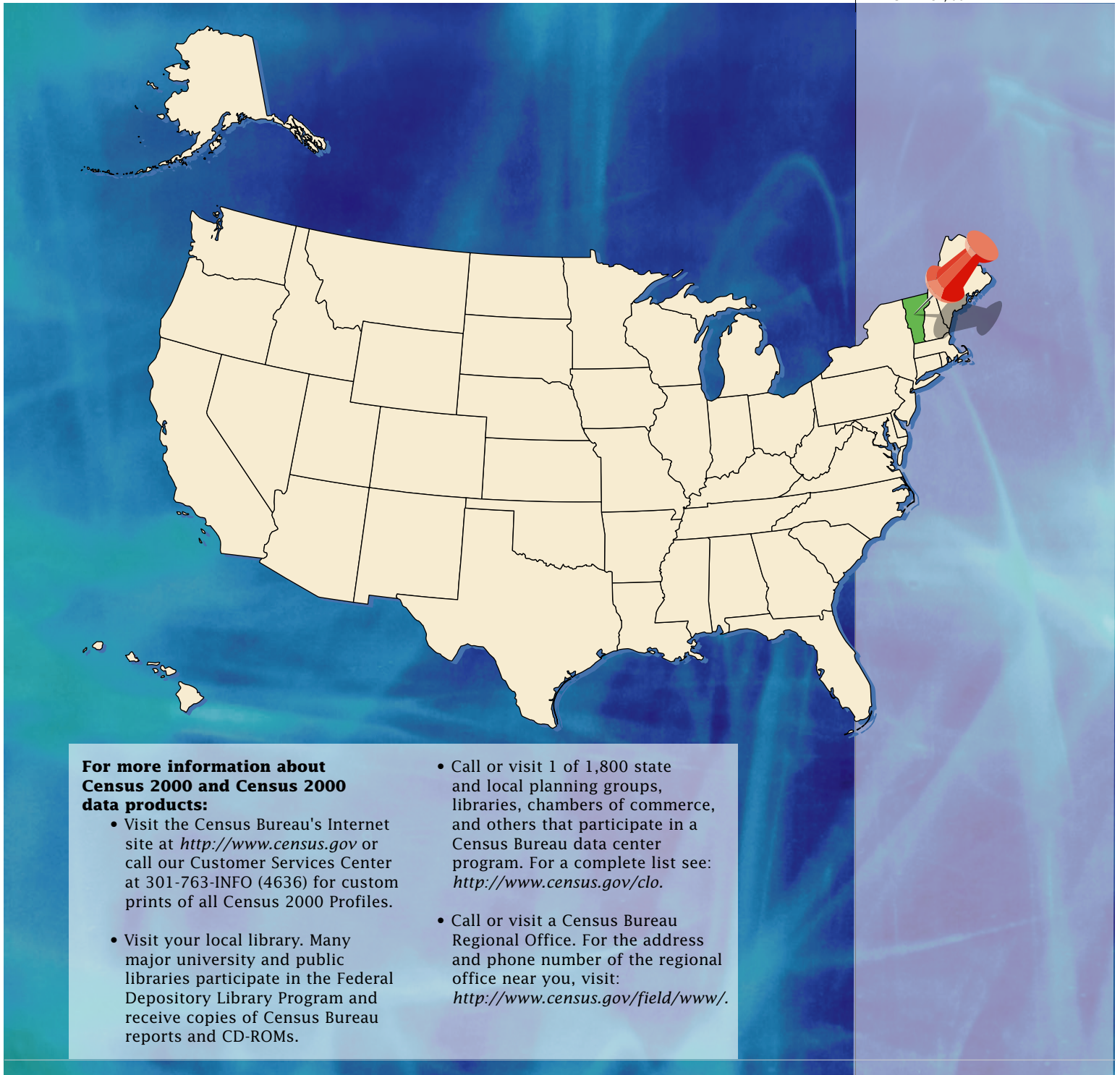

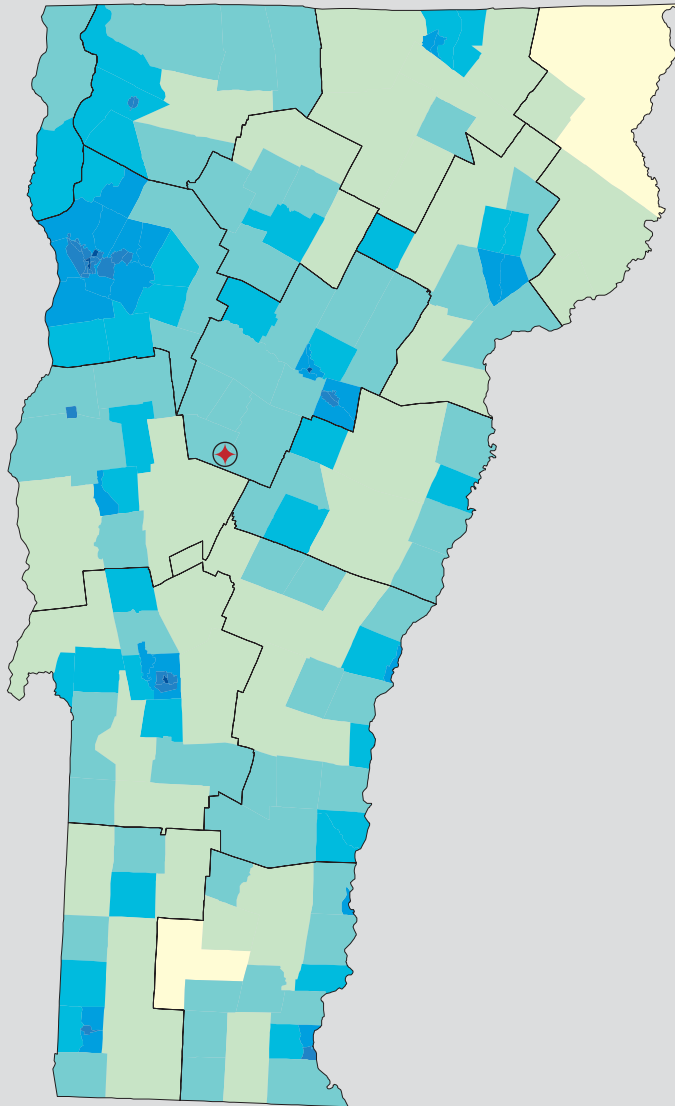

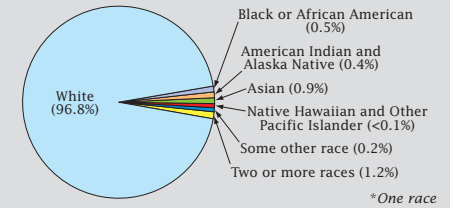

Population Density by Census Tract

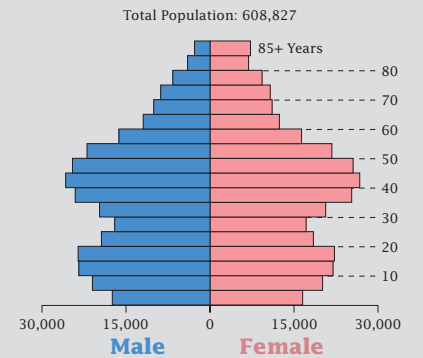


State Race* Breakdown

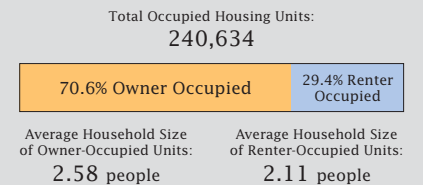


Hispanic or Latino (of any race) makes up **0.9%** of the state population.

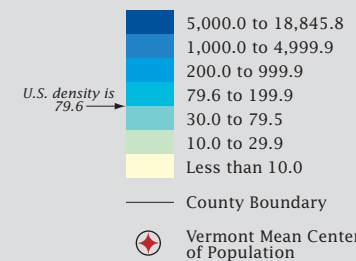
Population by Sex and Age
