Re: Your Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") Appeal (89-20) of November 13, 1989.

Dear Mr. Leonard:

This letter is in response to your FOIA appeal of November 13, 1989, which was received by the Legal Services Corporation ("LSC" or "Corporation") on November 15, 1989. Your appeal relates to the August 18, 1989, denial of access by the FOIA office of the Corporation to:

- (1) all hand written and other notes made by Darrcy Loveland during her inspection of the National Clearinghouse for Legal Services ("NCLS") personnel files; and
- (2) a copy of any written policy(ies) of LSC that authorized non-disclosure of notes made by monitors from personnel files of an LSC program during the course of a monitoring visit.

Upon review of the matter, I have concluded that the notes may not be released to you insofar as the records you seek are drawn from personnel files and contain factual information copied from those files. These records are exempt from disclosure as personnel files and information compiled for enforcing the Act. 45 C.F.R. §1602.9(a)(5) and (6). The Corporation will protect carefully the privacy interests of employees whose files it reviews.

As to your appeal of the written policy(ies) that authorize on-site non-disclosure by the monitors, the decision to disclose

such notes properly rests with the Corporation. 1 The Corporation's guidance on disclosure of such records is FOIA, 5 U.S.C. §552, 45 C.F.R. Part 1602, and such other provisions of law as may apply.

I, therefore, uphold the August 18, 1989, denial of your July 27, 1989, request for these documents.

It is important to note, however, that in a FOIA request for the same information from a third party requester, the privacy interests of the employee would be carefully protected.
