CARGO ships	Cargo ships do not fall under the Framework for Conditional Sailing Order and do not need CDC approval to embark or disembark crew members.			

- Crew should contact their cruise line for a disembarkation request. CDC must receive requests for disembarkation from the ship and not the crew member. Cruise lines can submit requests to CDC at eocevent349@cdc.gov.
